Core Services

These services will take place in a refugee's first month in the U.S. (unless delayed for some reason.) Once these services are complete, World Relief may close a refugee's case.

- Arrange housing & provide basic necessary items
 - Arrival: Make sure refugees are picked up from the airport
 - 2 Home Visits: 1st day in the U.S. and end of 1st month
 - Cultural Orientation Classes (3)
 - Department of Social Services (DSS): Food stamps, cash assistance, Medicaid
 - School Enrollment for Children (6-16 years old)
 - Referral to CWS (another refugee resettlement agency) for:
 - English Classes
 - Employment
 - Social Security Card
 - Health Screening
 - State ID
 - Case Closing (2nd or 3rd month)

Some refugees qualify for additional help:

- WIC: Women Infants, & Children
 - Additional food assistance for children under 5 and pregnant or breastfeeding mothers
- SSI: Supplemental Security Income
 - For those over 65 years of age
 - For those who are disabled
 - Additional cash assistance through Social Security
- Selective Service Registration
 - For males between 18 and 25 years of age
